



Inlet Air Ejectors

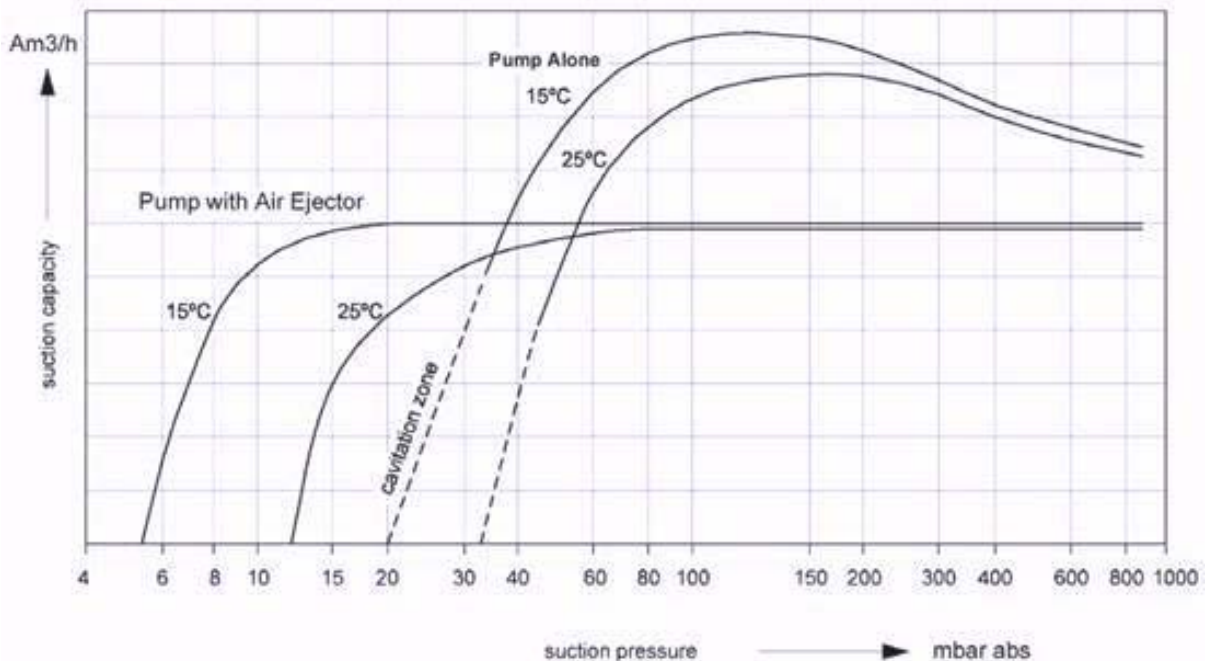
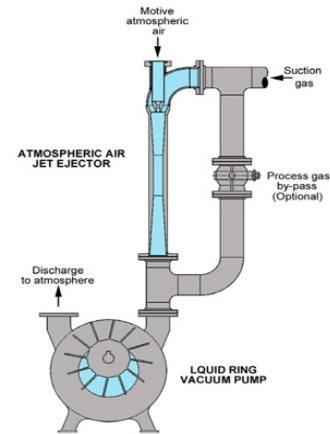
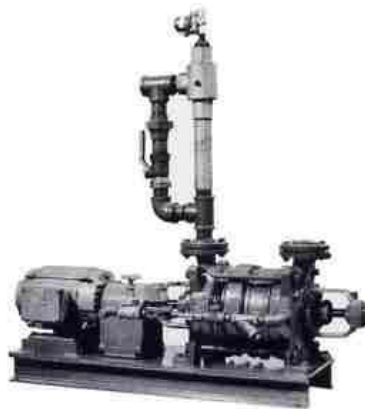
An inlet air ejector is a simple device which may be added to the inlet of a 2-stage liquid ring vacuum pump to provide an additional pumping stage. With no increase in horsepower, the air ejector can achieve significantly lower pressures than are possible with the vacuum pump alone.

The operation of the air ejector is similar to that of a water educator except that ambient air or recirculated discharge gas is used to provide the motive force for compressing the process gas from system pressure to the liquid ring pump's inlet pressure. The liquid ring pump handles both the process gas and motive gas.

With an air ejector, inlet pressures as low as 5 torr can be achieved. Pumping capacity at 15 torr and above is equal to about 50% of the capacity of the liquid ring pump alone when operating at 100 torr under standard conditions.

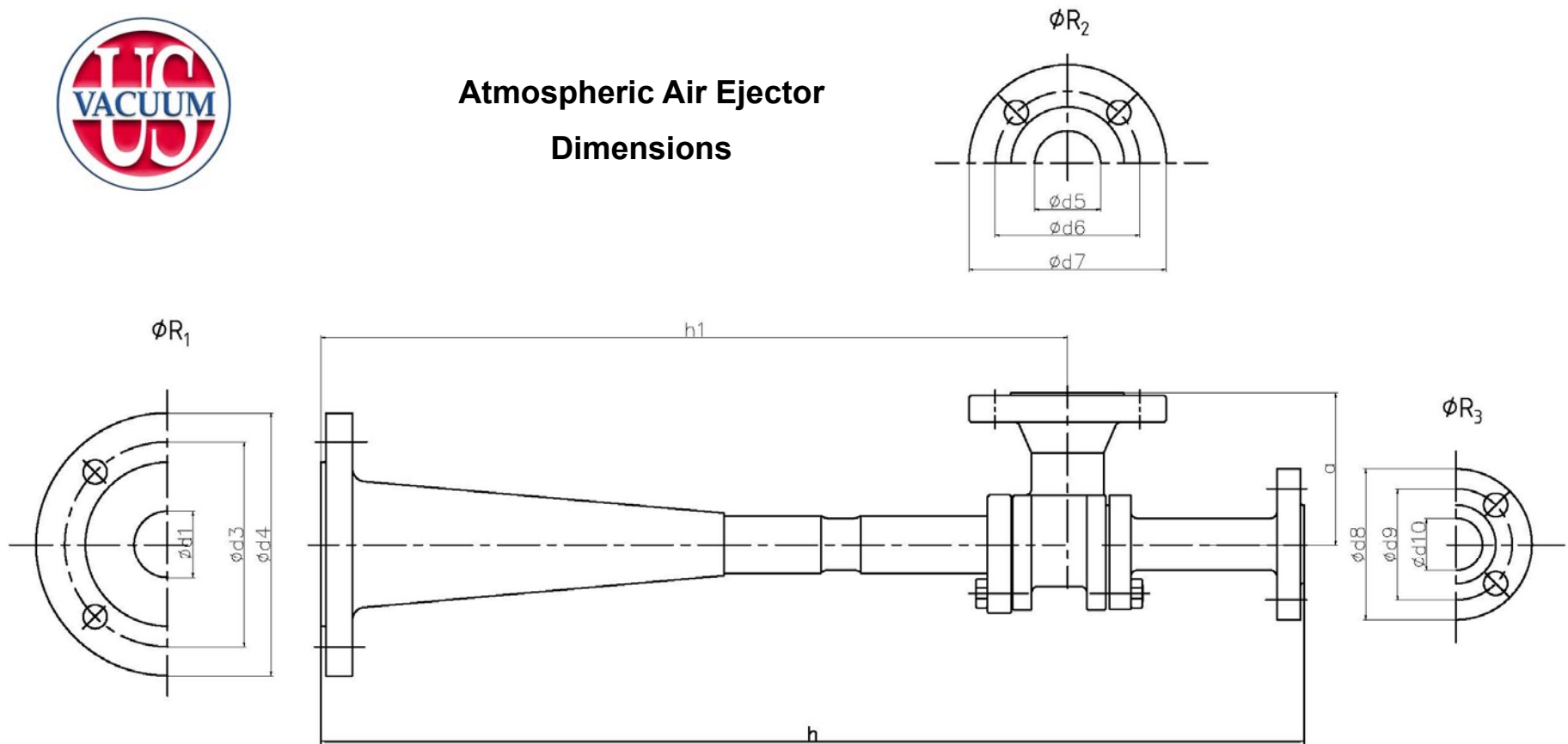
